Teaches English in Mexico

Gary Winston, son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Winston, of 24785 Ivywood, Farmington recently returned from a summer spent in Huitlaco, Guerrero, Mexico, teaching English to high school students, setting up recreation programs for young people, and showing educational films for adults. A senior majoring in languages, Winston was one of six students and recent graduates of U. of D. who were sponsored by the Conference on Inter-American Students for this inter-cultural exchange project. Winston attended meetings twice a week for one month preparing for life in Mexico. This training consisted of introducing the volunteers to the customs and culture of the Mexican people. In Huitlaco, Guerrero, the U. of D. group worked in cooperation with the town pastor, Rev. Pedro Ilurralde. The Conference on Inter-American Students (CIAS) is a Catholic student organization set up by the students themselves on a Catholic University campus or through a Catholic club on a secular campus. The primary goal of such summer projects is "inter-cultural exchange." The requests for volunteers come from the Catholic bishops of Mexico through the Maryknoll Missions Office in New York.

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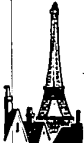
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Shoe Fitting Expert To be at Greg Shoes

"Parents, unknowingly, are probably the greatest hazard encountered in the proper fitting of children's shoes," says Dr. Ross A. Tennant, President of the American Shoe Fitting Institute. "It's not because they are not interested—they are; but as adults we put our own shoes according to the way they feel, but too often try to fit the child by the way the shoe looks. Too often the child is deprived of the very allowances we demand for ourselves."

Dr. Tennant will be at Greg Shoes, on Saturday, August 21, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. for free consultations. He offers the following advice: "The number one mistake is that too much emphasis and stock is taken in the size of the shoe and its comparison to the old one."



"IT IS PREFERABLE to measure the child's feet while standing. Even then the foot isn't measured to see what size shoe he wears but rather for an indication of foot size and this has to be applied to the dimensions of the shoes we are fitting. Some shoes run small to scale and we have to add a little to the measurement. Others will run large and we have to take a little away."

"Suggestion number one is to forget size and trust a reliable fitter to the use of the proper shoe. Everyone seems to be concerned about room for toes to grow, but let's be logical. As the foot grows, more than three-fourths of the growth is in the foot itself (from heel to ball) and less than one-fourth in the toes."

"Assuming there is room otherwise, the most important yet most overlooked area of fitting is throat room or room enough to allow the instep to move forward."

"A COMMON MISTAKE is too much emphasis on a tight heel fit. A bit of new shoe slippage is expected when the shoe is new and until the sole becomes well flexed. Any low heel closed shoe, such as an oxford, has to function with the foot. Any low heel, low but dress shoe or casual will tape on the sides as the heel is lifted in taking a step."

"A child's new shoe is naturally larger than his old ones and should have a gradual breaking in. Blisters are not uncommon but will seldom occur with a less vigorous breaking in."
