Col. Hagerman Named to Top Army Position

Named to the posts of Staff Training Assistant with the Michigan Military Establishment and as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, Plans and Training Officer, 11th Infantry Division, was Lieutenant Colonel Russell A. Hagerman, 45, formerly of Lansing and currently of Farmington.

Colonel Hagerman replaces Colonel Ralph C. Phillips in the dual capacity. Phillips was recently named as Military Support Plans Officer for Civil Defense.

Colonel Hagerman began his military career on October 19, 1940 when he enlisted as a Private in the 11th Field Artillery Battalion, Lansing.

He was inducted into Federal service for World War II on April 7, 1941, and served in the Asiatic-Pacific Theater of Operations in the Philippine Islands with the 11th Field Artillery, 24th Infantry Division.

Returning to the Michigan National Guard as a First Lieutenant in October 1946, he was again assigned to the 11th Field Artillery Battalion and served in various positions before accepting fulltime employment as a technician with Headquarters Battery, 11th Field Artillery Battalion, Hagerman served as technician with the Lansing unit from July 1949 to June 1950 when he was transferred to Headquarters, 46th Infantry Division, Artillery, Detroit, as Plans, Training and Operations Officer.

Promoted to Lieutenant Colonel in August 1950, Hagerman served the Detroit unit on a fulltime basis until being appointed to his new position which became effective on August 4.

A graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Colonel Hagerman and his wife (the former Alice Chapin of Lansing) will take up residence in Lansing at the end of this month.

Local Girls At Y-Teen Conference

Teen-age girls who are members of Y-Teen clubs in cities and towns throughout Michigan will gather at Camp Cayell, on Lake Huron near Lexington, August 22-27, for a Y-Teen state summer conference.

Afternoons will be left free for rest, swimming and recreation.

9 More Area Students Awarded Scholarships

Some additional 1,500 college scholarships have been awarded for 1955-56 through expansion of the state program under Act 358 of the 1953 Legislature. Acting Superintendent of Public Instruction Alexander J. Koster, who is Chairman of the Higher Education Assistance Authority which administers the program, said that the increase in appropriation has made it possible to help a total of 4,350 Michigan youth with their college expenses this year.

Dr. John Porter, Director of the authority, noted that the \$2,000,000 appropriated for

1955-56 scholarships has enabled the Authority to direct \$500,000 toward renewing 1,250 scholarship awards made last year and \$1,500,000 to support the new scholarships.

DR. PORTER ALSO noted that the Act allows the Authority to make Residual Awards, which will permit full use of the appropriated funds, and enable many more qualifying applicants to receive awards throughout their undergraduate years.

Financial need is carefully determined and a detailed analysis of the income and assets of each student and his family is conducted with the assistance of persons from the colleges who are chosen for their knowledge and experience in the area of financial aids. The need analysis system of College Scholarship Service is used to determine financial need.

The examination date for the 1956-57 scholarship program will be Saturday, November 20, 1955. Students desiring information about the state scholarship procedures for the 1956-57 year should contact their high school counselor or principal.

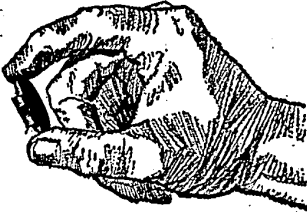
Tuition for residents of the College district is \$103 per session. Classes will begin on September 7.
