Nardin Park Methodist Church To Move Into New Building Sun.

After many months of planning and building, the Nardin Park Methodist Church will move into its new building at 25000 Middlebelt Road in time to hold the first Sunday morning Worship Service on September 12 at 10 a.m.

The Nardin Park Methodist Church was formed in 1927 from a union of two Methodist Churches in Northeast Detroit. Following leadership effected the union of the two congregations.

One of these churches was the Gravel Avenue Church, the Church located at the corner of Grand River and McGraw Avenues. Its history went back to 1887 when the church opened on McGraw Place in 1890. The following year the Hudson Avenue Church evolved, building a chapel at Hudson Avenue and Maybury Grand. A decade later the growing congregation moved to the Grand River Avenue Church, where it remained until 1917 when it was united with the Tracy Church which originated as a Mission Sunday School at the corner of Linwood Avenue and Joy Road. After a series of moves by 1912 it was definitely located on Grand River Avenue at West Chicago Boulevard, joining with the Winde congregation. In 1920 this church moved to Beverly Court.

After the union of the two congregations in 1927 a new building site was secured on Nardin Park at the present location of 5151 West Chicago Boulevard. An adequate educational and social unit was a chapel, forty class rooms and a large gymnasium was erected and dedicated in 1929.

THE FINANCIAL crash of 1929 and the subsequent economic depression thwarted the plan for completing the Sanctuary. After several years of money raising campaigns the old indebtedness was liquidated and sufficient funds secured to complete the building program.

In 1943 a Gothic Sanctuary was built at the West Chicago site. In the following years the city expanded, some of the surrounding area moved to the outskirts and suburbs. When the Ebenezer Methodist Church building was a condemned building by the City to make way for the new medical center, they asked Nardin Park to consider selling the West Chicago building to them.

On January 18, 1953, the Nardin Park congregation voted to sell their edifice to the Ebenezer Church; and after deciding on March 15, 1953, to build a new edifice, purchased the new building site at West 11 Mile and Middlebelt.

GROUND-BREAKING ceremonies took place on Sunday, October 6. The same shovel that was used for the start of the West Chicago Sanctuary Church was used for this occasion. Architects for the new building are Harold H. Fisher, Inc. and the Contractors are C. H. Davidson and Sons, Inc., both of Detroit. Helene Rother and Associates, also of Detroit, designed and installed the windows.

The new Sanctuary will accommodate 650. A Fellowship Hall will provide dining space for 400 and is also located that it will add additional seating space to the Sanctuary to provide total capacity of 1000. The organ was designed and constructed by the Organ Company of Canada. Modern fixtures, a finely equipped kitchen.

N. Congregational Organist Given Leave To Work On Ph.D.

Albert G. Bolitho, Organist and Director of Music for the North Congregational Church of Southfield has been granted a leave of absence in order to work on a Ph.D. at Michigan State University. A graduate of Wayne State University with both Bachelor and Master's Degrees, Mr. Bolitho has served North Church for eleven years and has maintained a program of sacred music of the highest caliber, both in the regular services and in special musical presentations of oratorios, organ recitals, cantatas, and others.

Mr. and Mrs. Bolitho and their three children will live on campus until August 1, 1966.

Robert F. Delany has been appointed Organist and Director of Music at North Church during Mr. Bolitho's absence. Mr. Delany is also a graduate of Wayne State University with Bachelor and Master's Degrees. He is a teacher of vocal music at McKenzie High School and Director of the Detroit Schoolmen's Chorus.

Mr. Delany has served as Director and Organist and Minister of Music in Mayflower Congregational, St. Mark's Methodist, Stratmoor Methodist and Nardin Park Methodist Churches. Mr. and Mrs. Delany have five children, two of whom are married, and live on Longacre Avenue in Detroit.

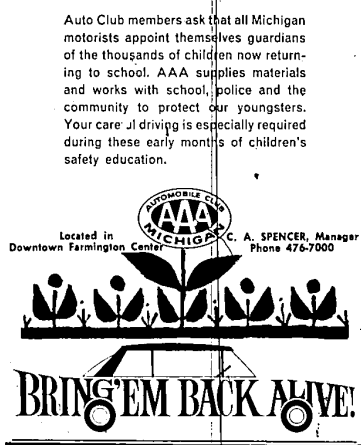
