LaLeche League Now Forming For Mothers in Farmington

The newly organized Farmington Group of La Leche League will hold its first meeting on Wednesday, September 29, 1965, at 8 p.m. at the home of discussion leader Mrs. Wilford Schaldenbrand, 476-4983.

(The name, La Leche, is Spanish and means "the milk". A non-sectarian, non-profit organization, the League's purpose is to help encourage "better mothering through breastfeeding".)

THE GROUP WILL meet every three weeks. A series of four meetings will discuss, informally, different phases of breastfeeding. Topic for first meeting: Advantages of Breastfeeding to Mother and Child.

All women who are interested in nursing their babies are invited... as are their babies. You need not be pregnant or even have a family to attend. If you are a wife and hope some day to have children, if you are a grandmother, if you are interested... you are welcome.

LA LECHE LEAGUE began in a Chicago suburb eight years ago, when one mother who had successfully nursed her baby, helped another who wanted to breastfeed.

This is still the basic approach, although the League is now international in scope, with more than 250 groups

helping thousands of women in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, and New Zealand.
