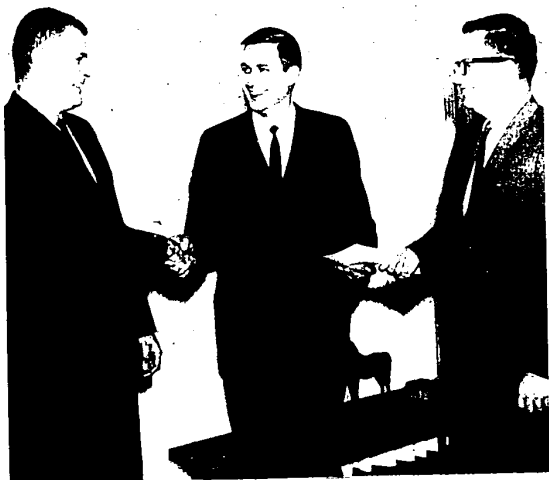

All parents of boys 8 to 11 years old are invited to attend. For further information call 476-1059.

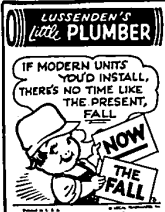

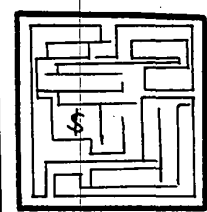
