Inter Lakes Conference Expansion Discussed

Possible expansion of its activities was the subject of a meeting of the Inter-Lakes Conference on Wednesday, October 13.

The conference which includes Farmington Senior High, Pontiac Northern, Walled Lake and Waterford, will enlarge when Adlai E. Stevenson High joins them in the spring.

The staff members who represented the schools, of course, stated that their objective is to widen the scope of the Inter-Lakes functions to include publications, debate, music, forensics, and student government. Presently athletics is the only area in which all the schools of the league participate actively.

Mr. James Geiger stated that the first task of the administrators will be to rewrite the Inter-Lakes constitution. They want to bring more students into activities by focusing attention on several divisions other than sports.

The members decided that an annual dinner meeting opening the fall term would be most beneficial in planning the activities for that year. The expansion will not become effective until the 1966-67 school year. The administrators hope that the Inter-Lakes League will become as active in these other divisions as they have become in athletics.

Coach Mr. Clarence Haus commented that in four games the Falcon Reserves have scored 84 points while the opposition has only counted up 21.
