St. John's To Dedicate New Wing

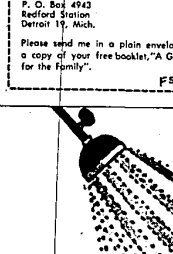
St. John American Lutheran Church of Farmington will dedicate its new education wing this Sunday. A special dedication service will begin at 4 p.m.

WSCS Sets Day of Prayer

Members of the Woman's Society of Christian Service of Orchard Methodist Church will participate this week in one of the most important annual observances of Methodist women throughout America. It is the "Call to Prayer and Self-Denial." More than 1,700,000 women in 38,000 local Woman's Societies and Quips in all 50 states will join in the observance.
On Tuesday, October 26, the Women of Orchard Methodist Church will hold a 12-hour prayer vigil in the church sanctuary from 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. The women are asked to come for thirty minutes throughout the day, so there will be continuous prayer for the twelve hour period. Mrs. Harry Davidson is chairman of this day's program. The call is sponsored by the Woman's Division of the Methodist Board of Missions. For 1965 the theme is "Attempt Great Things for God."
EACH YEAR CERTAIN mission projects in the United States and overseas are designated by the Woman's Division as beneficiaries of an offering which is given as a part of the Call to Prayer and Self-Denial. This year the projects are medical missions around the world and a new library for Scarritt College, Nashville, Tenn.
The call to Prayer and Self-Denial is one of the oldest observances for Methodist women, dating back to 1887. Each woman who participates is asked to make a sacrificial gift for the designated projects and is asked to offer prayer for workers in the projects to which they will give.
