Orchard Church To Consecrate Large New Educational Wing

Orchard Methodist Church continues to expand. A Ground-Breaking Service was held on Sunday, April 23, for the new Educational Building at the Church. At that time, when they wielded their shovels, two of the Sunday School pupils said, "...We break this ground today ... that a Church Educational Building may rise here where the Church shall educate children in its arms."

Six months later, Rev. Frank A. Cozadd and the Building Committee are able to announce that the Consecration of the new addition to Orchard Church will take place on Sunday, October 31, at 4 p.m. with Dr. Merle D. Broyles, District Superintendent officiating. Under the direction of Mrs. William Greene, all choirs will "sing their praises" at this very special event. There will be an Open House from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. sponsored by the Commission on Education. Everyone interested is invited to attend and to browse through the new building which will have a total capacity of 415 pupils for one hour's class - for all ages.

THE BUILDING contains ten classrooms, two offices, a prayer chapel, parlor, and utility rooms. There is a covered driveway entrance and additional parking at the south end of the structure. The exterior of the building is a blend of brick, quartz panels, and natural field stone. The cost is approximately \$190,000, including the furnishings.

In addition, improvements and modifications have been made in the present building.

The overseeing of this important undertaking of Orchard Church has been under the chairmanship of Mr. Myron Schiller.
