Twenty thousand educators will attend the annual Michigan Education Association Institute sessions Thursday and Friday, November 4 and 5 in Detroit and surrounding centers as teachers and administrators are brought up to date on matters of local, national and international importance as well as subject matter and professional items and details.

Several Farmington teachers will be participating actively in programs on Friday when educators will meet in various Detroit and suburban centers to pursue subject matter and professional items of progress.

JEANNETTE SENOB, kindergarten teacher at the Cloverdale School, will be chairman of the group meeting on International Understanding at Oakland University in Rochester. Assisting Mrs. Senob will be Wilma McCright, teacher of mathematics and chemistry at North Farmington High School and Raymond McCright, chairman of the mathematics department, North Farmington High School.

The McCrights will present "The View from Korea" with songs, dances, costumes and artifacts. Their adopted daughters from Korea (Lynn, Lee, and Suzy), will sing native

Korean songs in costumes. Mrs. Amy Adelman, vocal music consultant, will accompany the Korean children, and also teach Israeli folk songs and dances to the attending teachers. 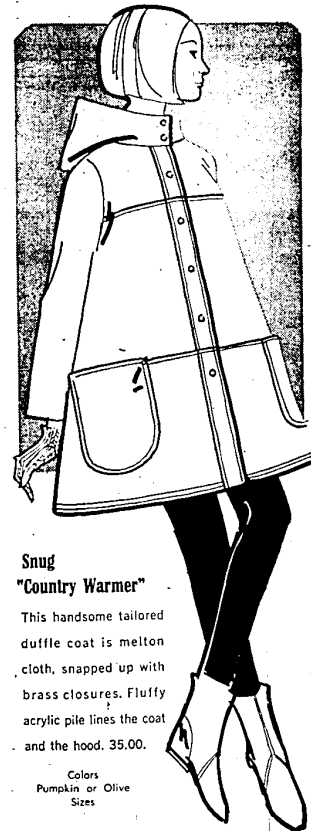

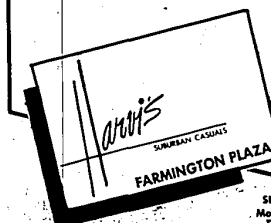
