

"Narcotics" Is Subject For Community Forum

"Narcotics" is the subject for the first session of the season for the Farmington Community Forum.

To be held at 8 p.m., November 20, in the meeting room of the First Farmington Savings and Loan building, the forum will present Dr. Herbert A. Raskin, a practicing psychiatrist in Detroit and a member of the faculty of Wayne State University, who will discuss the subject from different viewpoints.

Dr. Raskin has been described by Dr. Gottlieb, head of the Lafayette Clinic, as the foremost authority on the narcotics problem in this section of the country.

A PANEL OF interested citizens who will question Dr. Raskin after his speech are Maurice Foltz, Director of the City of Farmington Public Safety Department, who has lectured to some classes in the Farmington schools on drugs and addiction; the Reverend Robert Sawyer, a graduate of McCormick Theological Seminary and assistant pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington; and Richard M. Parra, former teacher and school psychologist in the Farmington schools and now a doctoral fellow in the Department of Special Education at Wayne State University.

Mr. Lee Peel, teacher of Journalism at Farmington High School, will moderate the discussion and the question period that follows.
