

Center Starts Wed. Games, Supervised Duplicate Play

Bridge players are needed for Wednesday morning duplicate games at Farmington Bridge Center. If someone is without a partner, a partner will be available at the center.

The Wednesday morning game is new, and follows the same procedure as the Thursday Early Bird game, meeting at 10 a.m. with baby sitter service available during the game. Sack lunches are to be brought for children. Dessert and coffee is served to the players.

Driver Bags Deer in Twp.

William Elders of Lincoln Park was a successful bagger of a deer in Farmington Township on Tuesday morning, November 18, but he may be a little chagrined at the damage to his new 1965 Chevrolet pickup truck which hadn't even been in for its 5,000 mile check.

Elders hit a 150-pound doe while driving northwest on I-66 between Grand River Avenue and Haggerty Road in Farmington Township at 7:15 a.m. on Tuesday. The deer, which was crossing from the north to the south side of the expressway, veered in the front end of Elders' truck causing several hundred dollars damage.

STATE TROOPER Thomas Grasel who took the accident report notified Michigan Conservation officer Robert Green in Detroit and cleared the way for a special permit so Elders could keep the deer, under a new State law regulating the disposition of deer killed on the highways out of season. The 34-year-old Elders lives at 1825 Arlington Ig Lincoln Park. His brother, Wayne, 25, was with him in the truck when the deer was hit. Both said the animal bounded in front of them too fast to avoid hitting it.
