Phone Program For Soldiers

Over 1,000 free phone calls to servicemen overseas, including some from the hottest trouble spots in the world, will be made this year under the ninth annual "Hi, Mom" program sponsored by the Communications Workers of America.

Charles Smith, president of CWA Local 9999 in Middletown, said his unit is one of hundreds of CWA Locals in all parts of the country which will be sponsoring free calls.

DESCRIBING CWA as "the community-minded union," Smith said the "Hi, Mom" program is one of several civic projects carried out throughout the year by the union. The Farmington area local 4015 this year will be financing ten calls, Smith said.

Families wishing to win a free call should write a request telling why they want to make the calls. Letters should be sent to CWA Local President Gerald Greer at 600 Ross Street in Plymouth or Jim Pagan of 15886 Denby, Detroit 39. Anyone with a son, daughter, husband or sweetheart overseas will be considered.

"But Mom gets the top priority," Smith added.

CWA, which represents over 200,000 workers in the telephone and allied communications industries, annually sponsors the "Hi, Mom" program in cooperation with the USO. This year, in addition to calls originating

from this country, the international union is financing 50 calls which will originate from overseas.

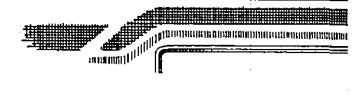
Smith said several of these calls will be made, with the cooperation of the Armed Forces.

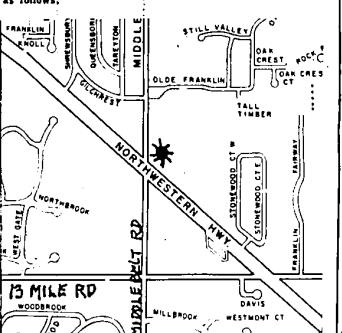
Petitioners request and the Planning Commission considers that the following described property be rezoned from parcels of R-1 business, O-Office and RA-1 single residential to all have R-2 multiple residential classification and the property be used for low rise apartment development. The location is close to the NE corner of Middlebelt Road and Northwestern Highway.

The requested rezoning applies to the following described parcel:


