Ex-Gangster To Preach At Bible B. Dedication
 Rev. Edmond Dinant, evangelist, who is called "The Minister of the Underworld," will preach every night during the dedication week of the Bible Baptist Church of Farmington.
 Rev. Dinant, who operated his own suicide gang in the days of Elliott Ness (the untouchables) in the same area as Valachi of the Cosa Nostra, has told his life story in more than 1,000 churches in over 40 states and in colleges and prisons.
 The Bible Baptist Church, which was begun by Rev. Charles Fisher and his wife early in 1963, has been meeting in Shiawassee Elementary School. On October 26, 1964, the church contracted to buy the Clarenceville Methodist Church building at 28312 Grand River, and will move into it this Sunday. (The Clarenceville Methodist Church is moving this week to its new location at 28300 Middlebelt Road.)

A FULL WEEK OF dedication ceremonies for the new home of the Bible Baptist Church has been planned. The grand opening is this Sunday, December 5, with services at 10 a.m., 11 a.m. and 7 p.m.
 Worship services will be held every evening through December 12 at 7:30 p.m. A special dedication banquet will be served on Saturday, December 11, at 6 p.m.
 Rev. Dinant will speak at all services during the dedication week. Rev. Charles Fisher, a known among the churches of the Bible Baptist fellowship in Michigan. His counseling is not limited to his local church, but he has extended a cordial invitation to everyone in the area to attend any or all of the services during the next week.

C'ville Church Moves To New Location Sunday
 The Clarenceville Methodist Church congregation leaves its old church on Grand River this week to take up permanent residence in their new church building at 28300 Middlebelt Road. Regular Sunday services will begin on December 5.
 The old building on Grand River is one of the oldest landmarks in the south west end of Farmington Township. It was built in 1920 by the Clarenceville Church and has been in use by them ever since. The present minister, Rev. Elsie A. Johns, has been pastor since 1941.
 Several years ago they bought the eight acre site on Middlebelt, and have just completed the first of a four-unit building plan. The present building, an educational unit, which gives ample room for their large Sunday School, nursery, offices, and a fellowship hall which will be used as a temporary worship center. This building was built at a cost of \$30,000. The Sanctuary will be built next, then the Chapel and, finally, a gymnasium.
 The Reverend Elsie A. Johns has extended a cordial invitation to all to stop in and see the new building.


