1. That the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, has tentatively declared its intention to make the following improvement:

Construction of sewers to be located in the Township as follows:

Grand River from Wly terminus of Assessor's Grand River Farm State Subdivision to Collingham.

Hancock from Shiawassee to Independence.

Walton from Shiawassee to Grand River Ave.

Verhulst from Shiawassee to S.W. terminus of lot 28 of Stoltz Sub.

Independence from Hancock to Colwell.

2. That plans showing the aforesaid improvement and the location thereof and an estimate of the cost thereof are on file with the Township Clerk for public examination.

3. That the Township Board has tentatively designated the following special assessment district against which the cost of said improvement is to be assessed, to-wit:

Lots 347 to 405, all inclusive, of Richland Gardens Sub.; lots 1 to 2 and 15 to 19, all inclusive, of Grand Gardens Sub.; lots 1 to 28, all inclusive, of Stoltz Sub.; lots 1 to 8 and 10 to 14, all inclusive, of Superior Sub.; lots 1 to 7, all inclusive, of Assessor's Grand River Farm State Sub.; lots 9 to 13, all inclusive, of William Shaw Sub.; N. 1/4 of lot 39 and lots 40 to 54 and 77 to 91, all inclusive, of Allered Plat of Grand River Farm Sub.; lots 9 to 48, all inclusive, of J. M. Cox Estate Sub.; all in the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan.

4. # North Church To Present Christmas Music

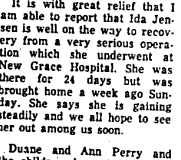
A Christmas musical program will be presented at North Congregational Church, Northwestern Highway at Lahser, on Sunday evening, December 12, at 7:30 p.m.
