Farmington Sailor Serving on USS Guam

Electrician's Mate Fireman Michael E. Kutachke, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry W. Kutachke of 2816 David Road in Farmington, departed Norfolk, Va. on Nov. 23, aboard the amphibious assault ship USS Guam, for a four-month deployment to the Caribbean.

As flagship for Amphibious Squadron 12, Guam carries a thousand-man Marine landing force with all their combat

supplies and equipment, and a Marine helicopter squadron composed of 24 transport helicopters. Several exercises are planned in which these Marines will be transported and landed at inland objectives by helicopter.

The ship is scheduled to visit several Caribbean ports, including San Juan, Puerto Rico, St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, and Trinidad, off the coast of Venezuela.

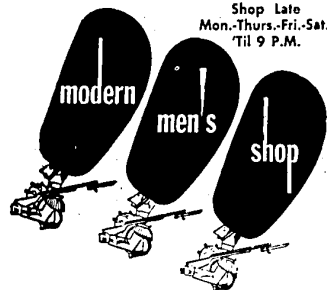

New Historical Exhibit Attracts Much Interest

The Farmington Historical Society's exhibit in the case that has been made available to them by the Metropolitan National Bank has attracted the interest of many people during the last few weeks. The

item that seems to cause the most comment is a 1906 tax statement showing a tax of \$13.50 for property evaluated at \$300.

Among other interesting items shown are a program for a dance held at the Owen House in 1885, a 1914 Enterprise, a woman's high laced shoe, a Quaker "Sunday-Go-to-Meeting" bonnet, and a book, "Polite Manual for Young Ladies," printed in 1847.

THE PICTURE at the top center of the case shows a group of students in front of the building that was formerly at the site of the Farmington Junior High School.
