

Local Coed In Court Of Lucia Queen

The Detroit Swedish Council sponsors the contest each year. Girls from the ages of 18-22 who are of Scandinavian descent compete in the contest.

The contestants are first narrowed down to a group of 12. Then the judges ask each girl to give a three-minute speech on her concept of the word "charity."

From these answers, six girls are chosen to be finalists in the contest. They must then answer the question, "What does light mean to you?" The topic of light is chosen because the word "Lucia" means light.

The answer to this question, plus the contributing factors of the girls' poise, personality, and beauty all go into the judges' choice of the queen.

This year's queen was Cherrie Moore of Grosse Pointe. Miss Brogren is a junior at Michigan State University and is majoring in education in the fields of math and science.

Last week Miss Brogren was elected vice-president of Zeta Tau Alpha sorority which underwent reconsecration last spring.

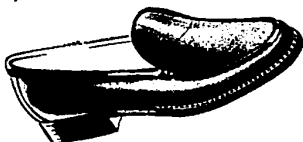

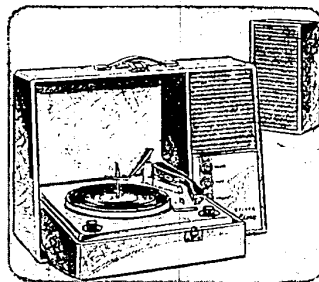

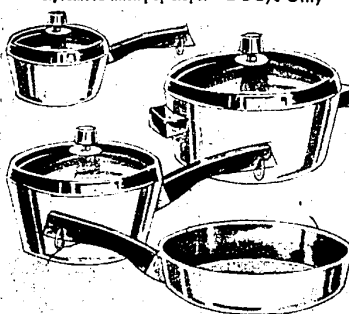
