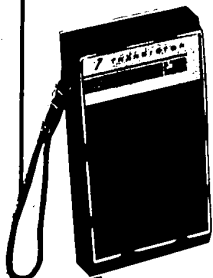

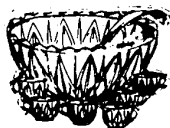

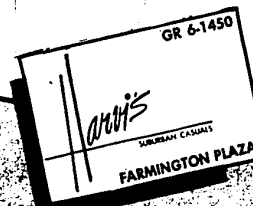
This chorus is a consistent first-place winner in barbershop singing contests, and will host a Regional convention to be held in Detroit next April.
