Plan Circuit Meeting Here

The Watchtower Bible and Tract Society of New York has officially announced its plans to sponsor a three-day circuit assembly for Jehovah's Witnesses in Detroit, January 14 to 16.

Upwards of 1700 delegates from Detroit, Farmington and surrounding areas are expected to attend the sessions and to assist in the religious work.

According to Mr. Ernest Stalina, presiding minister of the local congregation, assemblies of this type are held semi-annually for the purpose of strengthening Jehovah's Witnesses, and aiding them to expand their ministry. In fact, the theme for the forthcoming convention is "Increasing Our Praise to Jehovah."

The three-day program will include a variety of talks on Bible subjects. Many local ministers will discuss ministerial problems and demonstrate how Christians can overcome these to aid them in their ministry. The location of the meet will be announced at a later date.

The last convention for this circuit was held in Inkster last May. Peak attendance was Sunday afternoon when over 2,000 gathered to hear the main talk.

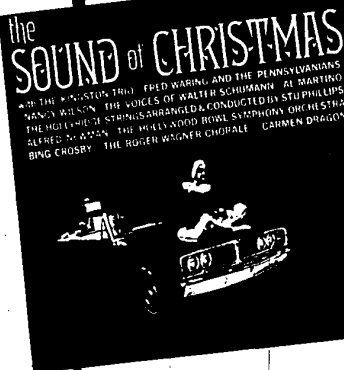
