# Farmington High Cagers Post 2-1 Record in Christmas Cage Tourney

Farmington High School cagers posted a 2-1 record in the Northwest Suburban Christmas Basketball Tournament staged over the holidays with victories over Redford Union, 66-51, and Wayne, 68-53, after opening night loss to Ypsilanti, 78 to 69.

The Falcons led Ypsilanti, 17 to 13, at the end of the first quarter in their opening cage tourney contest but Ypsilanti stormed back to out score the Blue and White 22 points. After succeeding periods to post the victory, FHS left the floor at intermission with a 36-35 edge but saved that up when they were out scored 25 to 18 and 16 to 15 in the final two periods.

STEVE MOORE, 6-4 senior forward for Farmington, led all scorers in the Ypsilanti tilt with ten field goals and five-for-eight at the free throw line for a total of 25 points. Junior forward Greg Dorow notched 15 points. Also hitting double figures for Farmington were Mike Ames, 6-4 junior center, with 13 points and All-Conference guard Mike Wilson with 11 points.

Senior guard Tim Patrick rounded out the Falcon scoring with five points.

Mike Ames, who poured in a total of 49 points during the three games, led the Falcon scoring effort in the victory over Redford Union last Tuesday night with 22 points. Also hitting double figures for Farmington were Wilson with 15, Dorow with 15 and Patrick with 11. Moore notched five points and the scoring for FHS.

Coach Jack Quiggle's minions had to come from behind to down Redford Union. FHS was shaded 29-28 at the half after taking a 14-10 first quarter lead. A strong second half effort out-distanced the visitors and saw Farmington hoop 38 points while holding Redford

Union to just 22. The 66-51 victory evened Farmington's tourney record going into the third and final game with Wayne on Thursday.

MIKE WILSON LED the Falcon scoring at attack against Wayne with 18 points to bring his output for the tourney to 45. Three other Falcons also hit double numbers, Ames with 14, Moore with 13 and Dorow with ten points. Patrick had nine points and George Haddock notched two and Tom Wirtz hooked one to round out the scoring.

An even scoring attack by the Falcons earned them victory over Wayne, 68 to 53. Farmington led at the intermission 33 to 28 after out-scoring Wayne 17-12 in the opening quarter and staying even at 16-16 in the second quarter. The Blue and White bulged their lead by ten points in the third period by out-scoring the visitors, 18 to 6, and traded baskets in the final stanza, 17-17, to claim the victory.

SENIOR TIM PATRICK earned the plaudits of coach Quiggle for his play during the tourney. He scored 25 points for the three games and turned in an impressive job at his guard position. The rebounding efforts of Moore and Ames also earned praise from the Falcon mentor.

Farmington opens its Inter-Lakes Conference schedule at Waterloo this Friday night. Walled Lake comes to Farmington for a league dual January 14.

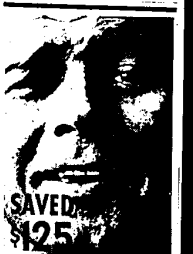
