## Historical Soc. To See Film Mich-igan-i-a

"Mich-igan-i-a," a new film produced by Consumers Power Co. will be one feature of the February 23 Farmington Historical Society meeting.

The meeting is at the Farmington Senior High Library at 8 p.m. The public is invited without charge.
