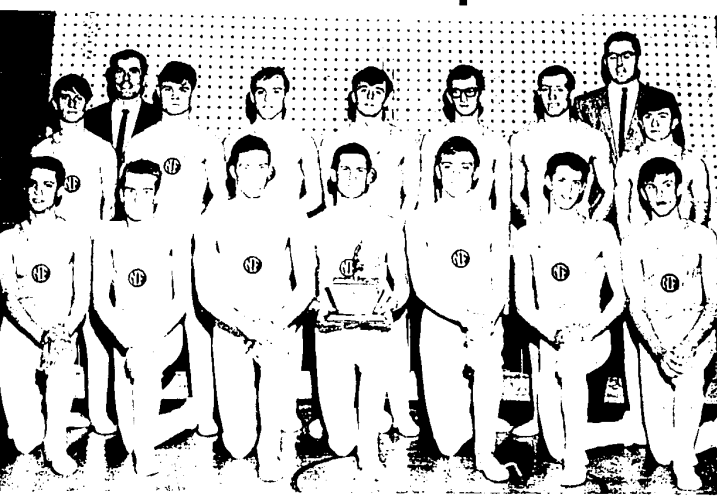


# State Champions

It was a very successful day for the boys at North. Their final score was 128.5, with their closest rival Ionia with 113.5. Ann Arbor, 94, last year's winning team came in third place and Alpena, was fourth.

The outstanding performer of the meet was George Hunticker from Ann Arbor. Hunticker, who earned the majority of Ann Arbor's points gaining five first places.

## Raider Matmen Post 7-3 Mark

The 1965-66 wrestling team proved to be the best yet for North Farmington, although their record was not quite as impressive as the preceding year. The Raiders finished the season with a 7-3 dual meet record, while last year it was 9-3 with two more dual meets.

The Raiders also easily finished second in the Northwest Suburban Conference as the year before with a 4-1 dual meet record and second place in the conference both years.

The Raiders had several good wrestlers in their seniors, Rick Dragan, at 103 pounds, Jim Dragan, at 112, Bernie Thompson and Mike Solar, at 120, Mark Campbell, wrestling at 127 or 130, Ray Roberts, at 145 or 154, Jack Allen, at 154 or 165, and Craig Wycinsky, wrestling heavy-weight. These wrestlers all had their first experience as wrestlers two years ago as sophomores at NF, except for Solar, who had previous experience at another school. They made up a large portion of the team the last three seasons.

While the Raiders' 4-1 conference record was second to Thurston's 5-0 record, they insured themselves of second place in conference by taking second place in the conference meet. The Raiders had a very good chance of taking first in the conference meet but unfortunately ran into some bad luck. Five NF wrestlers who undoubtedly deserved at least second place in the preliminary round, the man who went on to take first, and losing to him, were only able to take third.

The regional tournament in which the Raiders participated proved to be the toughest.
