Bond Fair Is Unique In Area

Bond School has the only science fair at the elementary level in the Farmington Public Schools, and it is rare in the area. This year's was the second fair Bond has staged. The first was in the spring of 1964. Principal Weldon Petz feels there is an advantage in keeping it biennial inasmuch as it does not dominate the year's curriculum nor pull on the interest of the children who are participating.

This year there were 340 displays from kindergartners through sixth graders. The total school enrollment is 498. Some science buffs among the students exhibited more than one project.

Every child who participated received a certificate of recognition. There were no ribbons awarded nor judging of projects although each display was accompanied by a form in which the student indicated the nature of his project, what he hoped to demonstrate, what he learned in carrying out the project and whether or not he had parental help. In a very simple format, this is the kind of project organization expected of junior and senior high school students who enter standard science fairs.

The projects were brought to school and assembled Monday, March 21. An Open House Tuesday evening, March 22, gave parents and the community an opportunity to view the display that filled the entire gymnasium at the school. Some 800 people attended.
