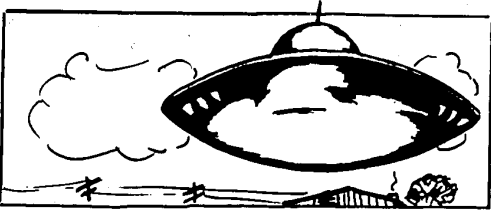
Town Club Sponsors Fashion-Card Party
