

Communion, Fasting and Prayers Mark Beginning of Lent

Lent Through The Ages

Lent, which began Wednesday, Feb. 23 with the traditional observance of Ash Wednesday, is a 40-day penitential period in the Christian Church, in preparation for the festival of Easter. The word "Lent" is of Anglo-Saxon ancestry, "lenten" or "lention" meaning Spring or the season of lengthening days. Since the penitential period of fasting, preceding Easter always came early in the year, the word "Lent" became synonymous with the season and has remained that way to this day.

The Pope's recent relaxation of Lenten rules of fast and abstinence is keeping with the changing history of Lent. In the days of Irenaeus, the fast before Easter was brief, but very severe. No food was eaten for 40 hours from the afternoon of Good Friday until Easter morning.
