

ASC to Spend Half Million for Expansion

BRISTOL, Conn.—Associated Spring Corporation will spend approximately half a million dollars to provide an expansion at one plant and an additional production line at another. It was announced by Carlyle F. Barnes, chairman, and Wallace Barnes, president. The corporation has a plant in Plymouth, Mich.

At ASC's Ohio Division, in Dayton, the plant will be expanded by approximately 11,000 square feet to provide space for increased production requirements. The division was established in 1947. After leasing the present facilities for a number of years, the plant was purchased in 1964. It was immediately expanded by 40 percent.

Current operations are at near-capacity levels and the division is committed to considerably higher volume this fall. Completion of the expansion this summer will bring total floor area to approximately 42,000 square feet of office and manufacturing space.

The new production line will be installed for the manufacturing of automotive valve springs at the Burlington, Ontario, plant of The Wallace Barnes Company, Ltd., ASC's Canadian springmaking unit. The plant, built in 1964 and expanded in 1965, specializes in the mass production of valve springs.

Associated Spring is the world's leading producer of precision mechanical springs. It also occupies an important position as a parts supplier to the automotive and marine trades and to industry and heavy equipment contractors.

WSU Offers Off-Campus Courses

Safe Boating Course Opens At Whittier

Basic seamanship and safe boat handling, a free course, is being offered by the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, Flotilla 123, at Whittier Jr. High, 28550 Ann Arbor Trail, between Inkster and Middlebelt in Livonia.

Classes started March 22, and will meet each Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. for eight weeks.

Some of the material to be covered will include: nautical language; engines, inboard and outboard; knot tying and splicing; basic navigation; compass and chart; piloting; and rules of the road.

All successfully completing the course will receive an official United States Coast Guard Certificate. The course tuition is free, but there will be a small charge to cover the cost of textbooks, charts, rope for knot tying, etc.

Men, women, and children over 14 are invited to attend. If you own a rowboat or a cruiser, planning to buy one, have a good friend that owns one, or just interested in boating, you will definitely benefit from a basic course of this type.
