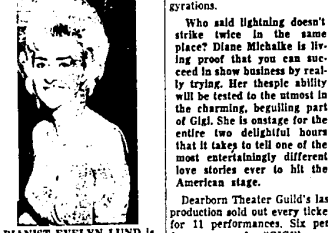

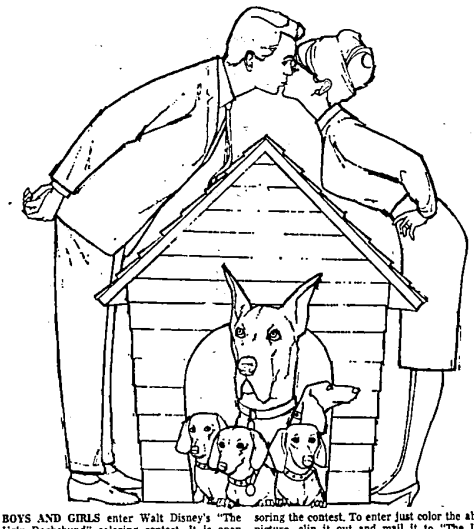
Harvard Group To Stage Comedy

DeSchmitt of Warner Brothers records, and Stan Fantich of Arc Record distributing.

The latest New York Pulse ratings show him in the number one position for his night stint. What's more, Gary has a new contract coming up soon—odds are it will contain a hefty raise. The cast for Oscar Wilde's "The Importance of Being Earnest," which opens at the Wayne State University Hilberly Classic Theatre May 11, has been announced by Richard D. Spear, director of the play.

Principal roles will be played by Robert E. Oram (John Worthing, J. P.), George Wright (Algernon Moncrieff), Gertrude Crippen (Lady Bracknell) and Marjorie Lesterum (Gwendolen Fairfax). The play, which Wilde himself called "a trivial comedy for serious people," will join five other plays now in repertory, including Shakespeare's "The Tempest" and "A Midsummer Night's Dream," Oliver Goldsmith's "She Stoops to Conquer," G. B. Shaw's "Saint Joan" and Thornton Wilder's "The Skin of Our Teeth."
