## 4,500 Added To Chrysler Pension List

Over 4,500 Chrysler Corporation employees and surviving spouses retired or became eligible for a pension under the company-paid pension plans last year. More than \$25.1 million was paid out during 1967 to all salaried and hourly retirees and eligible surviving spouses under the plans.

Beginning with retirements on or after Sept. 1, 1965, eligible employees who retire early or on a permanent total disability receive a supplemental allowance, which when added to their basic pension and temporary pension, if applicable, provides a total monthly pension benefit of up to \$400 per month. In 1967, retired employees received more than \$12 million in supplemental allowance.

Since the inception of the plans in 1950, Chrysler retirees have received approximately \$108.8 million in benefits.

The 1965 retirements bring the grand total of Chrysler employees and surviving spouses who have retired or become eligible for a pension under the plans to over 27,100. Of these, more than 20,000 are still living and receiving benefits.

Normal retirements, which generally begin at age 65, have accounted for approximately 15,000 of the retirements. Early retirements and deferred pensions have totaled over 7,000 and disability retirements over 2,100 since the plans began operating.

The pension plans are financed entirely by the company through pension funds which are held and invested by a number of banks acting as trustees. These funds cannot revert to Chrysler Corporation.

Pension benefits are paid in addition to federal social security payments received by eligible pensioners.

Other benefits available to retired employees include fully-paid hospital-surgical-medical coverage and life insurance which is continued at no cost to the retiree after age 65.
