New NBD Bank Opening To Feature Open House

Colorful flag raising ceremonies and two days of open house festivities will be held at the new Middlebelt-11 Mile Office of the National Bank of Detroit April 14 and 15.



The color guard and 25-member drum and bugle corps of Troop 289, sponsored by the Nardin Park Methodist Church will officiate at flag-raising ceremonies at 9 a.m. Thursday, April 14.

The Boy Scout band will play the National Anthem as the guard unit presents the colors. The troop will then lead assembled guests in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Farmington Township Supervisor Curtis Hall will officiate at ribbon-cutting ceremonies following the presentation of colors. Hall will be assisted by NBD-Farmington vice president Byron Lapham, office manager Richard Clarke and Miss NBD Ruth Street.

Lapham announced this week that veteran NBD employee Charles L. Wilson, has been named assistant manager of the Middlebelt-11 Mile Office. Wilson, of Southfield, has been associated with NBD since its founding in 1933 and has served the past three years in a customer relations capacity in the Farmington Office.

Open house festivities will be held at the Middlebelt-11 Mile Office from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Thursday, April 14, and from 9:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Friday, April 15.

The new facilities, of modern colonial design, replaces the bank's present office which was opened as a temporary facility on February 26, 1965. It was established as NBD's 78th office. The bank now has 85 locations in the metropolitan area.

The new building will provide more than 3,500 square feet of the most modern banking facilities available.

The building has a 76-foot frontage on the north side of 11 Mile Rd. and a 47-foot frontage on the west side of Middlebelt Rd. The building was designed by the Detroit architectural-engineering firm of C. E. Noelter.

The lower level includes storage and maintenance facilities; rest rooms; lounges; employees lunch room; and records vault. There are two drive-in windows located on the north side of the building with parking accommodations for more than 60 autos on the east and south sides of the building.

"This expansion and building program reflects the dynamic growth and economic activity of the Farmington Township area," vice-president Lapham said. "It is National Bank of Detroit's way of expressing its total commitment to the best interests of this part of our community."

5-The site is only 18 minutes driving time from the Plymouth area where many of the employees now live and will continue to live.

Stilby reiterated that the move from Plymouth wasn't for any cause but that the company officials decided to relocate because of the above listed advantages that a fast growing organization such as Alexander Hamilton must have to continue its tremendous growth.

"As a matter of fact," he said, "Several of our officers are residing in the City and Township of Plymouth and plan to remain. They have made their homes there and would like their families to grow up there and continue to be a part of the civic life of the community."

"The people of Plymouth

have been most gracious to all of us. We do not recall any single instance where a request has been made to the city that has been denied. We like Plymouth and the cultural atmosphere of the community but the reasons stated above are why our officers felt we had to move to the Farmington site."

At the same time of the announcement of the new building and the move, the company announced a complete realignment involving a number of major officers and staff title changes.

The new management plan categorizes the firm into three distinct segments: corporate, marketing and administrative.

The corporate division, under Board Chairman

Owens, will include: Rockwell Gust, the company's former Legal Counsel and Secretary as Vice President-General Counsel and Secretary;

Milby, previously vice president - Resident Advisory Board, as vice president-public relations; and Alya Fletcher, former vice president-controller as vice president-treasurer.

A new position, director of corporate relations, will be filled by Donald Starr, Ph.D., former assistant to the Board Chairman.

The balance of the operation, administrative and marketing, will be under the supervision of President Charles Bruce with Robert Safford named Executive Vice President in charge of Marketing and G. Eugene Davidson appointed Executive Vice President of Administrative division.

Jovite LaBonte, Jr., former second vice president-marketing, will serve as Vice President-Marketing under Safford.
