

"Ministry Open to Women" Says Rev. Elsie Johns

Upon entering the ramshackle, paintless building on Grand River in Farmington, Elsie Johns found a note pinned to the pulpit. "This church has no membership and no money. Here's a key to the building. And like a cruel parody of the song, 'the best is yet to come', there were other discourses in store. There was no water, and worse yet, no toilet facilities.

The former congregation after a bitter Hatfield-McCoy type feud, had departed leaving only weeds behind. The entire church, both spiritual and physical, was an utter wreck. Was Elsie Johns discouraged?

No, she regarded it as a challenge and used the winning combination of guts and hope to start the ball rolling in the other direction.

The first six Sundays she preached to a completely empty church. Then on the seventh, a break came in the form of a former friend at Highland Park, who came with her two sons. "I'll be back next week and we won't start a Sunday School," she promised Rev. Johns, and to her word, she did.

Interviewing Rev. Johns in the office of the beautiful new Clarenceville Methodist Church on Middlebelt Rd., it seemed a far cry from those days. The building, very modern, was completely streamlined in appearance and so was the Rev. Elsie Johns, a slender, attractive woman, modestly attired in a suit of rose color.

Rev. Johns likes to hark back to those days and does so without bitterness. She had a great belief in her God and knew that if she broke back, he would not fall her. Born in Calumet, she was raised in a devout Methodist family. After graduation from the University of Michigan, she worked as a supervisor of the billing department of the National Twist Drill Co. in the office of the beautiful new Clarenceville Methodist Church on Middlebelt Rd., it seemed a far cry from those days. The building, very modern, was completely streamlined in appearance and so was the Rev. Elsie Johns, a slender, attractive woman, modestly attired in a suit of rose color.

When it was in its beginning, Elsie (as she is affectionately called by her entire congregation) worked without pay. Gradually due to house to house solicitation of members, the congregation came to grow. The members pitched in and helped rebuild the old church house. And her employer, instead of chastising her for spending so much outside time in the church, gave her a substantial check to help her.

Gradually success came. Today there are Youth Groups, a Sunday School, a Women's Society of Christian Service, a Men's Club, and four choirs.

We were anxious to talk to Rev. Johns not only about her success but about whether she thought more women would enter the ministry. When we asked her who uncovered an other facet of her surprising personality. Rev. Johns is a newspaperman's delight. She is a forthright speaker and there is no "please don't quote me."

"I think more women will enter the ministry because there is a need for it. More men are leaving because of dissatisfaction" was her surprising statement.

"Should women ministers marry?" we asked her. "No," she said, "this is one of the few fields where women combine a career and marriage. There are too many demands on one's time."

Rev. Johns attributes her accomplishment to her dedication to the Word of God. She reads the Bible constantly and always says her best sermon "is the one she hasn't preached yet."

There have been many honors in her career. Her twenty-five years of ministerial leadership were filled up in song and praise as hundreds gathered to congratulate her at the St. John's Lutheran Church in Detroit, October, 1955.

An another honor is yet in store. This year she will take a trip to Palestine and the Holy Land.
