

Livonia Libraries Stock State Books

With more and more persons each year visiting the many historic and recreation spots throughout the country, "See America" is the great travel slogan of today.

According to Skip Rosenthal, city librarian, the Livonia Public Library has a number of books on travel in the United States which describe where to go, and what to do and see when you get there.

To help celebrate Michigan Week this month the Carl Sandburg Library will have on display an exhibit of materials relating to Michigan.

The Library has in its collection many books on Michigan as well as the other 49 states. Some of the books included in this collection are: Frederick Baldu's "Michigan in Four Centuries," Willis Dunbar's "Michigan: A History of the Wolverine State," and Gerald Schultz' "A History of Michigan's Thumb."

Books about travel in Michigan include: "Peninsular Country" by Raymond Burroughs, "Michigan" by the Writers Program, and "Headings in the Geography of Michigan" by Charles M. Davis.

Also available are books about other states. Some of the titles are "California," by Keith Monroe, "The New States: Alaska and Hawaii," by William Lineberry, and

Begin June 20 at Oakland U.

Oakland University, which operates on the year-round, three-semester plan, this year will offer its first summer session, according to Laxlo J. Hetenyi, dean of the School of Education and director of the summer school.

The eight-week program will run from June 20 to Aug. 12, and will offer courses leading to the Master of Arts degree in English and to the Master of Arts in Teaching in English, mathematics, elementary education and reading instruction.

According to Dean Hetenyi, the session was added to the University's calendar to accommodate area teachers and other persons interested in graduate work whose schedules do not permit them to enroll in the spring semester which begins in early May. It is expected that enrollment will also include advanced undergraduates who are interested in the courses offered.

Persons not registered in a degree program may register as guest students for individual courses, permanent certification or credits for transfer to another institution.
