Wally Roberts GOING UP 'CURTAIN'
The subject for today's theatrical talk may sound horticultural, but believe me, it's quite historic. In short, "The Subject Was Roses," the Frank Gilroy play at the Fisher Theater until June 4, forms the basis for our discussion this week.
Frank Albertson and Martin Sheen, two of the original cast when the show opened last May on Broadway, serve bushels all rovers for their stellar performances. Albertson has had 30 or 40 years of experience on the American stage mostly as a straight man for such vaudeville stars as Phil Silvers and Milton Berle. Martin Sheen is a relatively unknown, young actor who was out there hundreds of other actors that auditioned.
Martha Scott is the third and only other actor in this delicate heart-warming tale of a young man's arrival home from World War II. Miss Scott's approach to the role of the mother is tempered with great restraint. Her excellent underplaying in the big emotional scenes gives the entire production great strength.
"Subject Was Roses" is a dramatic study of what happens to a family when their son comes home a mature man. He had left for the Army still an adolescent. Now on return he finds the house a strange, hostile territory. Mom and Dad are unhappy and snap at each other. He feels ill at ease. Nothing seems the same.
All three members of the family in "Roses" finally realize that the process of growing up is extremely painful and must be accepted as a part of life. Any other conclusion in this play would have been mawkish, sentimental, and pure Pollyanna. Frank Gilroy has fashioned a perceptive commentary on American family mores "Roses" is tender, terse, and titanic in its impact. Easy to see why this play won the Pulitzer prize in 1965.
You'll have a second chance to see "Roses" later this summer on the National Playhouse. The Playhouse production will have Chester Morris and Maureen O'Sullivan doing the two leads. Of course, no such mer trio will ever top Albertson and Sheen, and Scott.
