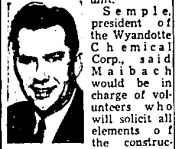


Ben Maibach Heads Unit In UF Drive

Robert B. Semple, 1966 Torch Drive co-chairman for chapter campaigns, today announced the appointment of Ben C. Maibach of Redford Township as chairman of the building and transportation unit.



Semple, president of the Wyandotte Chemical Corp., said that Maibach would be in charge of volunteers who will solicit all elements of the construction supply field, property management, maintenance and janitorial services and transportation industries as well as the employees of international and local unions.

Maibach is president of the Barton-Malow Co. general contractors in Oak Park. This year's Torch Drive will be held from Oct. 18 through Nov. 10 and will seek operating funds for nearly 200 health and social services.

The goal for the 1966 Torch Drive has not yet been announced but last year more than \$25 million was raised during the "Give Once for All" campaign.

In 1964, direct aid was brought to 1,200,000 people in 113 communities of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties through Torch Drive services. Included are 32 child care agencies which provide shelter, training and care for hundreds of homeless children; 25 health research centers fighting cancer, heart disease and other incurable diseases.

Also 54 health and medical agencies treating the sick and the handicapped; 32 services for the aging; 68 youth character-building agencies and 44 services for troubled families. Maibach, who lives at 14126 Fox Boulevard, Redford Township, has played a leading role in the Torch Drive for many years. Last year he served as building trade group chairman.

A graduate of Redford High School, Maibach attended engineering school nights at the University of Detroit and the University of Michigan. He started with Barton-Malow in 1938 as a construction laborer and timekeeper and progressed to his present position as director and president, which he attained in 1960. He is also the director and president of Fern Realty Corp. and the Cloverdale Rental Co.

An ordained minister and auxiliary of the Apostolic Christian Church, he has served as treasurer of the Apostolic Christian Mission Fund; director and assistant secretary of the church and a member of the executive committee, Apostolic Retarded Children's Foundation.

He was appointed to observe mission activities in Japan in 1958. In 1963 he was appointed assistant bishop of Japan churches.

He is a director and past president of the Detroit Chapter, Association of General Contractors; a director of the Greater Detroit Safety Council; a Trustee of the Barton-Malow Co.; a member of the Engineering Society of Detroit and the Michigan Safety Conference and an arbitrator for the American Arbitration Association.

U-M Opens Telescope To Public

ANN ARBOR—One of the University of Michigan's key scientific research facilities for exploring the Universe, the 85-foot diameter radio telescope, will open its grounds to the public on the third Sunday of each month from June through September, starting this Sunday, June 19.

Staff members of the University's Radio Astronomy Observatory will describe the operation of the radio telescope and how it receives natural radio waves coming from the sun, moon and planets in our solar system, from distant exploding galaxies and quasi-stellar radio sources.

Located 15 miles northwest of Ann Arbor, the 11-story-high dish antenna can be seen by visitors between 2 and 4:30 p.m. June 19, July 17, Aug. 21 and Sept. 18.

The Radio Astronomy Observatory is located at 10200 North Territorial Road, 3 miles north of Ann Arbor and 10 miles west of U.S. 23. The U.S. Navy through its Office of Naval Research has supported this facility since its inception in 1958.
