

Everybody said it was a beautiful wedding, but now it is over.

The cake is consumed, the flowers have faded, the rice has been swept up by the church custodian, and the groom is back from the cleaners and tucked away. The bride has had the car washed and the car wash is off.

And there he stands, your gorgeous new King of Hearts, hungry.

You can cook. Of course you can, even if you can't tell a griddle from a grater. Anyone who can read can cook, if she cares to. . . and especially if she cares for the person (or people) she cooks for. Right now, when "no two people have ever been so loved" as the bride and groom, it is the best possible time to begin.

Let me offer just two suggestions. First, don't fret for an instant about cooking like his mother used to cook, because you never will, for better or worse. Each cook has a different hand and a different inclination. Furthermore, you will be cooking for two, which is quite a different position from cooking for a whole family.

Second, if your cooking skills are relatively new, have a good start easy. It is folly to wear yourself and your enthusiasm ragged with overly ambitious kitchen experiments. Disappointment could defeat you, and that would be too bad. It could even be disastrous.

The Baked Stuffed Chicken. Cornish Game Hen with Sherried Orange Sauce can wait, and so can the Chestnut Purée in Meringue. Wait, maybe forever. Your problem is to get things in hand so the little won't be cooked to a crisp, and the big won't be underdone. If your stove or oven doesn't have a timer, you can get a little one at the dime store or somewhere.

In considering these things, there comes to mind the old question of which came first, the egg or the chicken. I have always been certain it was the chicken.


