State Police to Check Speeders Via Airplanes

Motorists suspected of speeding will be tipped by the State Police in a program which will be operated as being given information on it by State Police officers.

The teams will be in action during daylight hours, weather permitting, with allowances for refueling of planes, shifting of observation areas and other routine needs.

Additional patrol cars may be assigned to the planes, depending on the volume of traffic and number of violations observed. Having an observer in each plane makes it possible to clock two motorists at the same time if circumstances warrant.

The State Police planes, all Cessnas, are based at Lansing, Traverse City and Marquette and are piloted respectively by Sgt. Morton C. Main and Corporal Chester A. Nottage and Leland D. Albright. Each plane has a backup pilot.

The East Lansing and Traverse City planes will be on the sky watch in the Lower Peninsula. The Marquette plane will patrol highway sections in Upper Peninsula and some in northern Lower Michigan.

Preparing for this plane patrol car speed watch, State Police officers made personal visits to learn about such programs in Ohio and Illinois and also studied information on this activity received from Indiana and Kansas. At least 18 other states operate similar programs.

A sampling of results from other states for 1965 showed that Ohio made 6,603 sky watch arrests in 2,750 flight hours during the year and Kansas averaged 350 arrests a month.
