UP' GOING CURTAIN

Close to home the newest venture of the Ypsilanti Greek Theatre will unfurl its Doric columns to the breeze and inaugurate a potent pair of productions in an enclosed amphitheater. This first season for the professional company presenting classical Greek plays in English promises to be quite auspicious by showing plays by Aeschylus and Aristophanes: "The Oresteia" and "The Birds."

The Ypsilanti Greek Theatre has reconstructed and reworked the Briggs Athletic field on the campus of Eastern Michigan University so that a dynamic, provocative stage is ready for actors and members of the audience. Eventually the Greek Theatre will be housed in a magnificent 3-million theater in Ypsilanti's Riverside Park.

Such make-shift arrangements may seem to put a slight shroud on the coming events, but if you recollect the meager beginnings of the Stratford Shakespeare Festival, you, too, had to start with a tent. Their present two and one-half million dollar auditorium took four years to plan and construct.

Let's be thankful that enough interested citizens in the Ypsilanti Ann Arbor area have had the courage and tenacity to build the Greek Theatre project. Mrs. Clara Owens, a drama enthusiast and tireless worker, initiated the idea and has kept the creative spark alive for the past five years. Finally the Greek Theatre is going to open on June 28 with a fine array of talent.

Judith Anderson in "The Oresteia" and Bert Laehr in "The Birds" lead off the initial season. Mrs. Owens had hoped that a third production in the first season, but the Board of Directors felt the money for administrative quarters was needed at this time and voted to do only two plays.

On July 20, Pinter's "The Birthday Party" will have its American premiere for a four day run. To insure an accurate interpretation of this British masterpiece Roy Knight, a visiting professor from England, has been given the directorial assignment of "Birthday Party."

"Blithe Spirit" and "Così Fan Tutti," Mozart's comic opera, will close out the U of M summer season on August 3 and 10, respectively. All the productions are scheduled in the air-conditioned Lydell Mendelssohn Theater. Be sure to note that performances begin at 8 p.m. for the U of M Summer Festival.

The Stratford Shakespearean Festival opened a couple of weeks ago on June 6. This early starting date for the fourteenth season was done so that more tickets would be available. Over the years the Stratford Festival has grown in popularity so quickly that additional weeks are added each year.

"Henry V," "Henry VI," and "Twelfth Night" comprise the bill for the 1966 season. A box office report indicates that already 50 percent of the tickets have been purchased. Nice to know that you have over a half a million in the till as the season starts.

Ladywood Actors Touring England

A group of Ladywood students are currently touring England because they participated in the high school's annual play.

This year's dramatic presentation at the girls' high school located in Livonia was Jane Austen's "Pride and Prejudice."

Cast members of the production along with boys from Salesian and the University of Detroit high schools who appeared in the male roles are among the 80 teenagers from the metropolitan area who will stage dramas in English churches and town halls in the Lake District of England located about 200 miles north of London.

Included in the company's repertory are excerpts from Shakespearean plays. The youths come from a total of 12 high schools — six public and six Catholic.

Accompanying them on the tour are chaperones including two Felician Sisters, Sister M. Janine, CSSF, and Sister M. Lillios, CSSF. They are both faculty members at Ladywood.

The tour which includes Catholics, Lutherans, Presbyterians, Baptists and Episcopalians in the number has been termed as an ecumenical.
