## Dewline

Detroit's main claim to musical fame, Motown Records, is expanding its corporate offices rapidly. As you have probably heard by now, Dick Clark's "Where the Action Is" ABC-TV'er is coming in to the city to shoot on location from the Rooster Tail on Thursday, June 30 (not July 1 as reported in other papers).

The park show will be a salute to Detroit talent and the "Detroit Sound." Artists to appear on the show will include Marvin Gaye, the Four Tops, the Spinners and Kim Weston. Dave Prince, host of Club 1270 on WXYZ-TV has also been invited, set for a live appearance on the "Action."

Motown also announced plans for an all-encompassing operation to be set up on the west coast. In line with these plans, they have hired Sheryl Berger, formerly a personal manager in Hollywood, to handle securing motion picture roles for Detroit recording stars, securing motion picture title songs, and planning artist appearances on TV from the coast.

The label further expressed interest in investing in Broadway productions and is currently reviewing several scripts by top Broadway writers and composers. Meanwhile, V.P. Barney Ales keeps adding on to his mansion being built in Farmington Township.

"Ballad of the Green Berets" which was a number one record in the United States for SSgt. Barry Sadler has now filtered across the ocean and is causing East Germany to see "red."

The song has been officially banned as "American propaganda" in the Communist countries but has managed to filter across the wall via West German radio stations.

The result was a strong indictment in the Communist newspaper Junge Welt which said that the song was being sung all over East Germany and played at dances.

The man responsible for the whole thing, Barry Sadler, will be in Detroit to tape for a Club 1270 appearance on June 28.

Brian Epstein has opened up a management company in New York, where he plans to handle the careers of American artists.

The first addition to his roster was a group called "The Crystals." Not a bad way to start since the group has the current top ten record, "Red Rubber Ball" on their first recording try. Of course, Epstein isn't exactly an amateur at the game — he is also responsible for the Beatles.

Johnny Rivers returns again by popular demand this week and next at the Gay Haven. He's also set for an appearance with Dave Prince on Club 1270 June 25th.

As a matter of fact, Detroit has been alive with talent the last few weeks. Visitors have included the Four Seasons, Leslie Gore, Johnny Mathis, the Kingston Trio, the Beau Brummels, Bobby Vee, Mitch Ryder, Freddie Cannon who will be at the Driftwood Lounge next week, and Steve Lawrence and Eddie Gorme who currently head the billing at the Fisher.

The Supremes, who drew more attention than Johnny Mathis when they were in attendance at his opening night concert at the Fisher last week, have been booked for three weeks at the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas beginning Sept. 29. They are also pointed for a tour of Japan and the Far East in the late fall.

The Rooster Tail's Upper Deck had its grand opening celebration last week to formally introduce remodeling, expansion, and a new stage area. Even though it is now by far the largest club of its type in the city, many have still had to stand in line for hours to get in. Judging from the looks however, it's worth it.

The Muzzle Leaders Festival is included in the regular admission charge to Greenfield Village.
