Nankin Mills Extension Group held its May meeting at the home of Mrs. Ignatius Dziedac, 29983 John Hawk, Garden City.

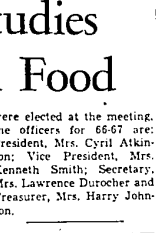
The members took a trip back through time to the founding of Detroit and the early history of Michigan.
