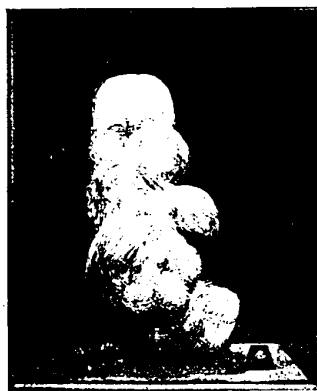

Eliminate Those Grays
Graying of fabrics is generally caused by using insufficient detergent, water that is not hot enough or a combination of the two.

To restore fabric brightness and cleanness, simply set your home hot water heater two or three notches higher and increase the amount of detergent added to the washer, or use the regular amount of detergent and add a non-precipitating water softener.

Put the clothing through normal wash cycles until the gray disappears—it may take three or four consecutive washings to do the job.

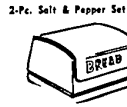
