

YMCA To Offer Seminar On Grade School Child

The course will begin on April 27, and the objectives are listed as follows: to assist parents in understanding behavior of grade school age children; To identify types of behavior in children that are normal and appropriate at various stages of development; To help parents feel more comfortable in dealing with situations involving their grade schoolers; To lend support to parents in their role as parents.

Eight sessions will cover What is Normal Behavior? on April 27; Family Relationships, May 4; School, May 11; Physical Development, May 18; Discipline, May 25; Developing Ethics and Morals, June 1; Emotional Development, June 8; Summary and General Discussion, June 15.

June 8, Summary and Program leadership will be the responsibility of Dr. Sanford Bloomberg, a practicing psychiatrist in Farmington; Mrs. Margaret Morris from the YMCA program committee; various community resource people; who are specialists in their respective areas including Dr. Allen Sozin, Mrs. Jean Ralph, Rev. Richard Markham, and Dr. Utecht.

Pre-registration is a must; the group will be limited to 24 people. Attendance at all sessions is required. The seminar will benefit with meetings scheduled from 8:30 to 10 p.m. at the YMCA.

Registration fee for each participant will be given to each participant. A YMCA membership plus a \$5.00 program fee per person or \$8.00 for husband and wife will be charged to help cover the expenses incurred. It must be paid at time of registration.

1. That refunds of connection charges previously paid shall be made from the Farmington Interceptor District by the Township Treasurer, on demand, where, at the time such sewer connection charges were paid, public sanitary sewer service was available with respect to the particular property for which the connection charge was paid. No refund will be made, however, except in accordance with the following:

a) No public sanitary sewer is available to serve the property involved at the time demand for refund is made.

b) No public sanitary sewer designed to serve such property is under construction, will be constructed under a special assessment district, or will otherwise be provided within a six month period following the date of the demand.

c) Refund shall only be made to the person who actually paid the connection charge, and the receipt therefor, and is the owner of the property involved on the date of the demand.

TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON 28-16A AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE No. 29 OF APPEAL to amend Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER ACT 154, PUBLIC ACTS OF 1943, AS AMENDED, GOVERNING THE UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN, TO REGULATE AND RESTRICT THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND FOR TRADE, INDUSTRY, RESIDENCE AND FOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC OR OTHER SPECIFIED USES; AND TO REGULATE AND LIMIT THE HEIGHT AND BULK OF BUILDINGS AND OTHER STRUCTURES; AND TO REGULATE AND LIMIT THE DENSITY OF POPULATION; AND FOR SAID PURPOSES TO DIVIDE THE TOWNSHIP INTO DISTRICTS AND ESTABLISH THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH DISTRICTS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; ESTABLISHING A BOARD OF APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE."

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:

Section One.

That the zoning map of said Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended to show RC-2 district classification where RA-2 district classification is now shown in the area described as follows:
