

Col. Robert McMath Gets New Guard Post

Colonel Robert McMath, Director of Operations, Headquarters, will become the new 127th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing Commander of the Michigan Air National Guard.

Colonel McMath, who in civilian life is a pilot with Ford Motor Company, has been active in the Michigan Air National Guard for almost 20 years. During World War II he flew 35 missions as a B-17 pilot over

As a Guardsman, he has commanded a squadron, a group, and was Wing Director of Operations before moving to the State Headquarters. The 127th Wing he now commands controls the activities of the group in Battle Creek, two groups in Detroit, and the reconnaissance group at Lincoln, Nebraska.
