

**Lincoln Welton Announces
Candidacy for Probate Court**

Wins Albion Honor

Richard A. McGaw, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alastair McGaw, 3370 Glenview, has been named to the Contributors' Club at Albion College. It is an honor society in the field of English.

"There's a probate court in your future," predicts Lincoln Welton, candidate for the Oakland County Probate Court in the August 2 primary.

Determined to reveal the popular and effective function of this judicial office, Welton bases his campaign upon the need to spell out this welcome service to the community.



"THE PROBATE Court affects family affairs more directly than any other. This Court will handle your estate, take care of your spouses and children, appoint guardians for minors and incompetents. Welton, 52, lives in Farmington Township with his wife and children Marles, his 19-year-old daughter is a student at Northwestern University, graduated from North Farmington High School and his son, Bob, 15, attends O. E. Dunkel Junior High School in Farmington.

HE IS THE TREASURER of the Probate Section of the State Bar of Michigan, previously serving as councilman. He is a Fellow of the American College of Probate Counsel, an honor accorded experienced men in probate affairs. He served as President of Northwest Lawyers Association, Chairman of the Michigan Conference of Bar Officers and is a member of the Professional Economics Committee of the State Bar.

Presently Council representative of the Boy Scouts of America, he is an International award-winning Past President of a Kiwanis club.

He has been in numerous civic and community affairs and recently participated in the Governor's Conference on Local Government. The Probate Court and its functions has been his subject in numerous talks before civic and church groups.

Welton has been a practicing lawyer for twenty-six years. He is rated "extremely able" by Genesee Probate Judge Frank L. McAviney; Saginaw Probate Judge Glenn Jordan, and Kent County Probate Judge, Wallace Waalkes.

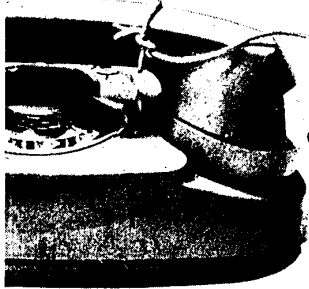
