Will Farmington Township citizens be afraid to TRY to write a home rule charter for the permanent and stable government of our area?

This is the question that will be decided on June 6th. We are not voting to establish a city at this time. The details need to be worked out and an acceptable charter written and a majority vote of the people approving that charter before Farmington Township can become a city. The election on June 6th determines whether we will try, nothing more. It gives us time to work out our local affairs without danger from being split up by annexations and partial incorporations.
