25th Anniversary For Rev. Carl E. Mehl

A worship service in honor of the Rev. Carl E. Mehl's twenty-fifth year in the holy ministry will be held at 4 p.m. June 12 at the Peace Lutheran Church, Twelve Mile and Farmington Roads, Farmington, Michigan. All members and friends of the congregation are cordially invited to share in this celebration. Immediately after the church service a program and reception will be held at D. E. Duckel Junior High School.
The Rev. Carl Mehl was born October 17, 1916, in Farmington, Mich. the son of Rev. Mrs. Theodore J. Mehl, pastor emeritus of Wheatridge, Colorado. He aspired to the ministry at a very early age and attended grade school through the first eight grades. After grade school he was tutored by his father, for about one year, in subjects necessary for entering into preparation for the ministry.
PASTOR MEHL entered preparatory school at St. Paul's College, Concordia, Missouri, in 1930 for six years of study. After preparatory school, he enrolled at Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis for his final four years of training for the ministry, graduating in 1940. This period included one year of vicarious work in Missouri. He was ordained in 1941 and then worked as a radio announcer for Station KFDJ, St. Louis, for about one year.
The Rev. Mehl then embarked upon a variety of church assignments, including pastor of an extensive background in the work of the Lord. He has served in the following positions: Pastor of Zion Lutheran Church, Oakton, Wisconsin; organizer and Pastor of Our Saviour, Preble, Wisconsin; Pastor of Faith Lutheran Church, Denver, Colorado; organizer of Sunday Day School during his pastorate here; Field Secretary for Lutheran Radio Station KFUD; resident of vicars at Trinity Lutheran, Macon, Georgia, where, under God, he was permitted to build a \$150,000 church and educational building in addition to the Ascension Lutheran Church in Atlanta, Georgia, serving as its pastor for eighteen months un-til full-time minister was called.

II. OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSITION

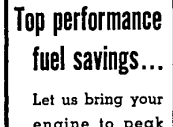
