Dr. Homer F. Weir, medical superintendent of Plymouth State Home and Training School, was on hand to accept a check in the amount of \$650, which will make possible the purchase of a necessary one-arm drive wheelchair for a small child, and braces for another.

As a token of appreciation to Our Lady of Sorrows for their cooperation and help with the annual card party, a small electric hand organ was also presented to the home in their name, to be used with some of the children in the blind retarded wing.

A gift donation of \$75 was presented to Mrs. Lester Crossett, who represented O. E. Dunkel Junior High School; it will be used for a filmstrip projector which the school needs.

ALTHOUGH NOT ABLE to be on hand to receive the gift, Mrs. Emanuel Ginzler, librarian at North Farmington High School, was also given a \$75 check which will make possible the purchase of two expensive, but extremely useful reference books for the school: Columbia Lippincott's *Gazetteer of the World* and *Chambers' Biographical Dictionary*.

A check for \$50 was presented to John Watzke, representing the Boy Scouts, and is a contribution to their Clinch Valley Lost Lake Reservation Development Fund.

Mrs. John Beiseigel, who is active in the Girl Scouts in our community, was pleased to accept a check for \$50, to be placed in the fund for campship awards for deserving girls.

The Campfire Girls' organization also received a gift of \$50 which was presented to Mrs. Richard Steiger, and will be used for the purchase of permanent equipment for their day camp.

The objective of the club which is to take an active part in civic, social, and moral welfare of the community by giving of their time and energy for worthy purposes, was certainly achieved.
