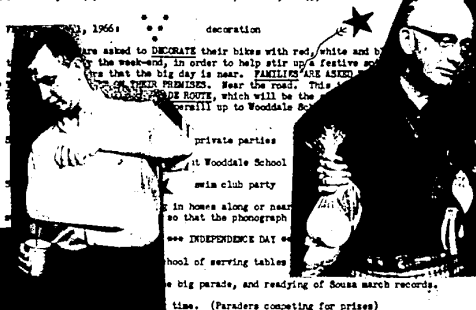
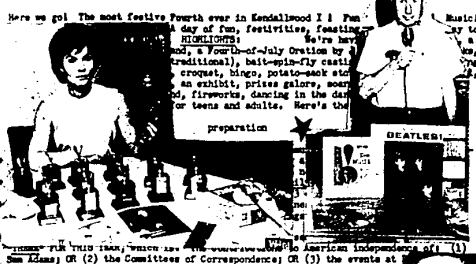
The installing officer was Mrs. John A. Scerif, a past president. The new officers were presented with corsages. The new club year for Botsford Garden Club will begin in September with a tea.

Takes Radio Course

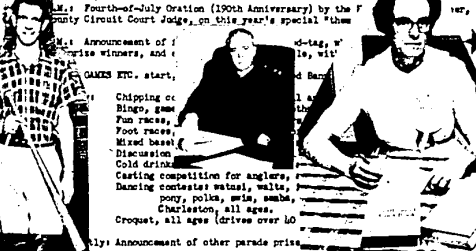

AFS Tour To Stop Here On Nation Wide Jaunt

Farmington will welcome thirty-nine American Field Service students representing twenty-five countries to the community for the week-end of July 9 to 12. The AFS chapters of North Farmington and Farmington High Schools are hosts to these students and their two chaperons.

These students have been attending various high schools in New York state this past year and they are now taking a three week tour of the United States ending the tour in Washington D.C. where President Johnson will receive them. From Washington they go to a final meeting of all this year's American Field Service students to evaluate their year in the United States and immediately following, return to their own countries.

A week-end has been planned that should be informative and fun for these guests. The Greyhound Bus which carries the students will be met on Saturday evening by the forty host families.

Sunday there will be a choice of two tours: Downtown Detroit and the Art Center or Cranbrook School and Museum followed by a pot-luck supper for the students and their host families.

On Monday City Manager John Dinan will welcome the students to Farmington at 9:30 a.m. on the steps of the City Hall after which they will visit Court and then have a picnic lunch on the lawn of the Masonic Lodge. Anyone in town at this time is invited to stop and say hello to them.

In the afternoon a tour of the Ford Rouge Plant has been planned and in the evening a splash party. Tuesday morning leave will be taken from the parking lot of the First Presbyterian Church and their tour will continue.

Farmington has taken part in the American Field Service Scholarship Program since 1956. In 1963 a second chapter was chartered at North Farmington High School. This past year there have been two students here: Monica Radicefelli from Argentina, has been living with the Richard Griswold family and has attended North Farmington High School, and Erwin Furlan from Guatemala has lived with the Harry Kelleh family and attended Farmington High School.

The end-of-stay bus trips are designed by the AFS to introduce the students to communities and regions of the United States other than where they have lived for the preceding year. The trips also give an estimated 100,000 Americans a chance to meet boys and girls from all over the world.

The American Field Service slogan is "Walk together, talk together. Do ye peoples of the earth: Then and only then shall ye have peace."
