Over 300 flower buffs, from as far as Saline, Michigan, flocked to the Mall to enter their scapes (stems) and arrangements in The Southern Michigan Iris and Hemmerocallis Society's first Day Lily Show and Judging.

The categories represented and their respective chairmen were: (1) Horticultural, Dr. H. E. Viergutz of Farmington, and (2) Arrangements, of which there were eight thematic divisions. Mrs. Harold T. Gots of Inkster, Michigan.

Grand slam winner William Simon of Garden City, Michigan won the three top honors of the show, sweepstakes (for having won 10 blue ribbons Queen of the Show (for best bloom of the show) and National Award (for the best of name variety).
