SECTION 800 - paragraph 4, add a subsection e. e. No sign attached to a building or free standing shall exceed the maximum height allowed for buildings in 8-2 Districts.

SECTION 900 - paragraph 10, add a subsection d.

d. No sign attached to a building or free standing shall exceed the maximum height allowed for buildings in B-3 Districts.

SECTION 1103 - paragraph 1, add as follows: No sign attached to a building or free standing shall exceed the maximum height allowed for buildings in LI-1 Districts.

SECTION THREE.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect upon publication of the Ordinance in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.

SECTION FOUR.
