The meeting's program also will include introduction of Eagle faculty members by Margaret Cottrell, principal.

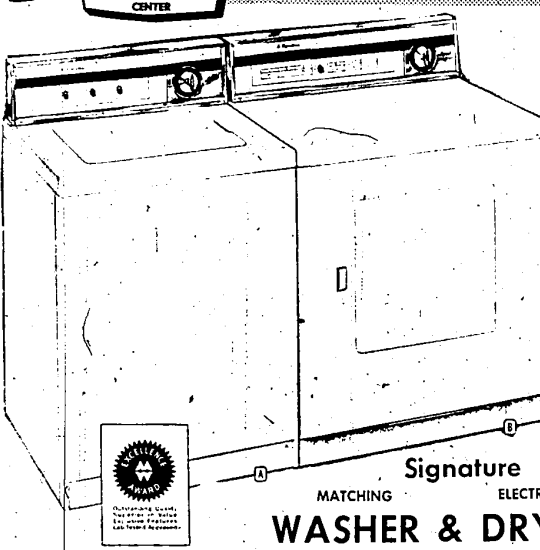

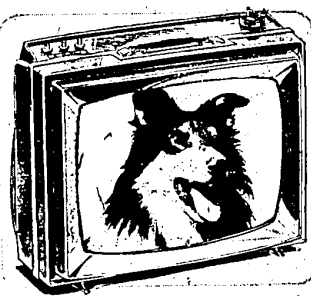

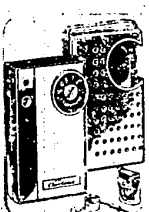
