AGRICULTURE IN URUQUAY.

The assistance given to agricul-inre by the government of Uruguay is rapidly changing the interior of the country from a pastoral to an-agricultural area. The results ob-ained do not compare favorably with he results in other countries where modern methods have been in use for many years, but the Uruguayan farmers are not discouraged. Gov-ernment aid is extended in the way of encouraging the planting of arti-ficial forests, colonization, exempting from customs duties agricultural im-plements and machinary, seeds and binding twine; organising contests of agricultural motors; creation of the office of agricultural defense and the engagement of experts in a num-ber of branches.

SURE CURE FOR SNAKE BITE

Pasteur Institute at Paris Reports Dis-covery of Toxin That Has Proved Its Value.

It is stated that about 20,000 persons are bitten annually by the co-bras of India, and until a short time bras of India, and until a short time ago these bites were generally fatal, but the discovery of an antiroxin has been the means of cutting down the number of deaths very materially. The same statement applies to the several hundred which are bitten several hundred which are bitten, cach year by the poisonous snakes of this country. The discovery of this remedy was due to the activities of the Pasteur institute in Paris. Dr. Raymond Ditmark, curator of the reptile department of the New York soological garden, has been handling and hunting snakes for 20 years, and has never been bitten, and in his the standard of the process of snake in the process of snake and has never been bitten, and in his recollection only three cases of snake hite have been called to his attention in New York, and as these were within recent times they were all cured by the antitoxin, which is always kept on hand at the New York Pastery institute.
