Busyness could include protest activity, aggressiveness, people speaking their piece, some of the positive reactions remote to ideas of 10 to 15 years ago."

A MAN OF THE TIMES, the pastor strongly supports the role the church is taking today, even the controversies in which it has become embroiled.

"In circumstances where action is contrary to law," he says, "if the law is unjust every effort must be made to change ill. Trecognize the problems created when every man takes responsibility on himself to judge for himself what law is just.

"But," he continues, "if a law must be broken to force a court decision, it should be done, However, laws of moral conscience are different than lawd of protection and order. The laws being broken today by chirchmen are laws of moral conscience."

He accuses the church and Sunday Schools today of antiquated irrelevancy and sterility."

In the church's defense, he adds, "It is obvious that the church today is much more involved in the lives of people than ever before. It has long pussysfooted around, but in the last decade it has done something, The layman may disassociate Sunday mornings from the other six days, but now the church is involved in those six days."
